## 1.3.1. Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

At Gian Jyoti Institute of Management and Technology (GJIMT), the curriculum is thoughtfully designed to integrate cross-disciplinary themes such as gender equity, environmental sustainability, human values, and professional ethics, fostering holistic student development. Throughout the academic year, various initiatives support these objectives.

**Gender Equity** is promoted through gender-focused courses and activities, including the annual *Sodashi* event by the Women Empowerment Cell, Sanitary Pad Donation Drive programs organized by Rotaract, NCC, and NSS. Workshops on financial independence, health, and empowerment foster an inclusive campus environment.

**Environmental Sustainability** is emphasized through a mandatory Environmental Studies course and active participation in initiatives like GJEco-Wave, ARE – Action for Restoring Environment Chaired by Prof. Chetan Solanki, Safai Abhiyan Campaign, Celebration of World Water day etc. earning the institute national recognition. Additional activities include water harvesting, solar energy projects, and e-waste drives.

**Human Values** are cultivated through core courses and the implementation of a Model Code of Ethics. NSS and Rotaract organize blood donation camps, vaccination drives, and health check-ups, instilling social responsibility.

**Professional Ethics** are embedded into the academic structure, with workshops, seminars, and programs such as the Placement Readiness Program (PRP), Internship Readiness Program (IRP), and Employment Readiness Program (ERP), preparing students comprehensively for professional success.
