INDIA'S NEW IT RULES ON AI CONTENT

The Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) in

India has proposed significant amendments to the Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021 ("IT Rules 2021") to regulate content created or modified by artificial intelligence - often called deepfakes" or synthetic media. The draft is open for stakeholder feedback until November 6, 2025.
